

“ I’m not a thief or a terrorist; I didn’t do anything wrong. I was trafficked here, given a fake passport, beaten and forced to be a prostitute.

Then they sent me to a detention centre.

In detention they forget you are human. They lock you up. You can stay there forever if there’s no one to help. ”

Mimi was 17 when she and her baby, Alice, were detained in Yarl's Wood Immigration Removal Centre.

Her only crime? Given a false passport, trafficked into the UK and forced to have sex with at least ten men every week.

Mimi and Alice should be free.

We need at least 100,000 signatures to force MPs to debate the issue.
